

Participant Responsibilities

Program participants are required to:

- Comply with the program requirements and attend scheduled appointments with physician and case manager.
- Inform the case manager within 30 days of any changes in address, eligibility, mode of treatment, other source of health care coverage, and/or family size.
- Provide the case manager with information of hospitalization stays and insurance co-payments for the treatment of CF.
- Participant in a quality of life and satisfaction survey.

The Adult Cystic Fibrosis Program (ACFP)

ACFP provides services throughout the State of Florida and has two funding sources:

- ◆ The Florida Department of Health (DOH), General Revenue Program and
- ◆ The Florida Department of Health (DOH) and the Agency for Healthcare Administration (AHCA, Florida Medicaid) CF Medicaid Waiver Program

These programs are payers of last resort and supports after all other resources have been exhausted and serve as an enhancement to resources the individual may already have in place (services that may not be covered by insurance or another funding source).

The program was developed to provide access to appropriate and timely healthcare services for adults with Cystic Fibrosis (CF). It is the mission of the ACFP:

- To promote the personal responsibility in the management and treatment of CF;
- To achieve and maintain economic self-sufficiency for adults with CF who are able to remain in the workforce;
- To reduce or eliminate the financial responsibility incurred by publicly-funded healthcare programs;
- To distribute the cost of CF care among public and private healthcare providers.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for the Adult Cystic Fibrosis Program, an individual must meet the following requirements:

- Have a diagnosis of Cystic Fibrosis.
- Live in the State of Florida with the intent to stay.
- Have need for medically necessary services not covered as a medical benefit under any group or individual health insurance policy.
- Have a monthly income of _____ or less. If the individual has out-of-pocket costs for the treatment for CF, these expenses may be reduced from the total monthly income.
- Have case assets that are less than or equal to \$2,000.
- Provide to the case manager full, truthful and correct information necessary to determine eligibility and liability on forms specified.
- Obtain physician sponsorship in the program.
- Agree to the participant responsibilities required by the program.

Services

The following may be provided if prescribed by a physician:

- Medical case management services to assist with continuity and coordination of medical care
- Assistance in obtaining health insurance for adults with CF, for the provision of medical care and services required for the care of CF
- Assistance for the rental, purchase and/or acquisition of medically necessary items and services
- Assistance with insurance services, medical co-payments & premiums
- Medical equipment
- Chest Physiotherapy (CPT)
- Medications
- ADEK vitamins
- Caloric supplements
- Homemaker services
- Pulmonary Rehabilitation
- Specialized medical equipment
